Summary

In 2015, the Scholes Library at Alfred University hosted the National Library of Medicine's "Harry Potter's World" traveling exhibit. To welcome the exhibit, forge ties with the campus and community, and raise awareness of our collections, we created a two month long event series in the university libraries. The product of collaborations with university staff, faculty members, student groups, and local public libraries, this event series energized the Alfred community, created new connections between the library and outside institutions, and brought several hundred additional patrons into the libraries.

Needs Assessment

The transformation of Alfred University into the Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry was rooted in the library's strategic planning process. At the time, we had just finalized our strategic plan, and were consequently seeking ways to foster collaboration between the libraries, and to connect to the campus community both significant elements of the new plan. We began exploring the National Library of Medicine's exhibit and its relationship to our collection, needs, and goals.

Our primary objectives in creating the Harry Potter's World Event Series were:

- To increase student awareness of and comfort with library resources and facilities
- To foster connections and collaborations with other organizations on campus
- To foster connections and collaborations between the University Libraries and the surrounding community

Implementation

The remarkable range of enthusiasm for the project inspired us to expand on our original plans, transforming our publicity program into a two month long outreach event—one designed to make contact with every corner of our campus and surrounding community. The publicity team worked to create an exciting and broad-ranging selection of materials messaging in support of the event series. Our most iconic publicity material was Hogwarts acceptance letter that served as our official brochure. The publicity team also made extensive use of more traditional communication methods, promoting the event series broadly and creatively.

Some of the primary outreach events included:

- A horcrux scavenger hunt for incoming students
- The opening reception
- The "Hogwarts University" lecture series
- A juried student art exhibit
- A themed trivia night
- The "Halloween Ball" closing reception

Evaluation

Even simply by the numbers, the Harry Potter's World outreach program was a success in bringing more people into contact with the library and its resources. Between the lectures, receptions, scavenger hunt, trivia night, and movie showing, the events brought in over 350 participants—an exceptional number at a small institution, one where a successful library event typically draws 10-15 attendees.

The collaborative efforts between the Scholes Library and our partners in creating the Harry Potter's World series were indispensable in the success of the program. The most notable evidence of our success in crafting connections was the proliferation of concurrent, externally organized and hosted Harry Potter's World events in the surrounding community. When our planning team reached out to local organizations, we were met with exceptional enthusiasm


for the program, and as a result were able to extend our event's reach beyond the bounds of the university.

In order to more methodically gather feedback insights and on experience, we conducted a survey in January of 2016, a few months after the exhibit closed. Respondents were asked to rate each event they had attended, and all our events were overwhelmingly rated as "good," "very good," or "excellent." When participants were given an opportunity to share their thoughts on the series, the positive reception we had perceived anecdotally was carried out in the results. Several respondents reported that they appreciated the link our events provided between Harry Potter and the real world of academia, in keeping with our theme, Scholarship of Harry Potter."

"HARRY POTTER'S WORLD" COMING TO SCHOLES LIBRARY

I'm pleased to announce that the Scholes Library will be hosting the "Harry Potter's World: Renaissance Science, Magic, and Medicine" exhibit from the National Library of Medicine, from August 31st through October 10th! The exhibit will be accompanied by opening and closing receptions, contests, a series of lectures and events, and much more.

The Harry Potter's World exhibit is a traveling piece that focuses on the Renaissance traditions—scientific,philosophical, and mythological—that influenced the magic and culture in the world of Rowling's books. Including images of primary sources on topics from alchemy to botany and magical beasts, the National Library of Medicine's materials will be supplemented by items from our own collection. Items such as the Magiae Universalis Naturae et Artis (as seen below), a 17th century text from special collections, will be on display, tracing the relationships between alchemy, metallurgy, and chemistry.

HORCRUXES HUNTED ON SATURDAY

This Saturday, a group of incoming freshmen familiarized themselves with the campus in a new and challenging wayby tracking down horcruxes in the Horcrux Scavenger Hunt, the first event of the Harry Potter's World series.

Arranged into five (randomly named) teams—The Bludgers, The Grangers, The Snapes, The Broomsticks, and The Lupins—these students raced each other around Alfred University, using a set of seven clues to track down the hidden horcruxes, based on the magical artifacts from the sixth and seventh Harry Potter books. To get credit for finding each horcrux, they had to take a picture of the entire team with it and send it to the hogwarts@alfred email account. From where we sat at mission control on that beautiful sunny day, it looked like a blast! Ultimately, the Broomsticks took first place, with the Bludgers and Snapes coming in close second and third respectively.

In the order in which the horcruxes were found in the original books, we present to you the horcrux hunters of Alfred University:





Tom Riddle's diary was turned into a Horcrux while he was still at Hogwarts, sent back to Hogwarts castle by Lucius Malfoy, and destroyed beneath the dungeons of the Hogwarts castle. We hid ours on the front doors of Steinheim Castle, where it often proved a challenge for team members to squeeze themselves in for the selfie.



There's Chinese Medicine in Harry Potter?

What does traditional Chinese medicine have to do with the world of Harry Potter? A great deal, as it turns out.

Acupuncturist, Kevin Ferst spent the evening of Sept. 10 in Herrick Library demonstrating the healing properties of herbs and correlating them to the Harry Potter universe.

"Some of the ideas of Chinese medicine seemed like you could describe them in the framework of Harry Potter," said Ferst.

He began by explaining the Doctrine of Signatures, which basically says that the shape or color of an herb corresponds to the shape of the organ it can treat. For instance, ginger root is shaped like the stomach and is good for stomach ailments. Red gogi berries are good for blood disorders.

The Doctrine of Signatures can also be applied more abstractly. Spiky herbs like bupleurum can be used to treat seizures. The avocado is used for assistance in meeting dietary recommendations during pregnancy.

Ferst recalled the scene from Harry Potter and the Cham-



knee wind and can be treated with cinnamon.

Ferst also explained the restless organ condition which describes someone with visceral agitation who experiences frequent sorrow and weepiness. To any Harry Potter fan, this is reminiscent of Moaning Myrtle. The aim in treating this condition is to return drifting souls to a normal bodily attachment.

At the event's conclusion, I had the chance to speak with AU alumni, Scott Patrick and his daughter, Lanna, 11, who is currently working her way through the fifth Harry Potter book, Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix.

Alohomora Into Herbology

The Polyjuice Potion to turn Alfred into Hogwarts

"What would I get if I added powdered root of asphodel to an infusion of wormwood?" asks Professor Severus Snape in Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone.

While I'm not sure what the result would be there, I can tell you that powdered Salix alba bark mixed with water, then filtered and consumed will act as an excellent pain reliever.

Dr. John D'Angelo, who teaches chemistry at AU, tried his hand as a potions master in the first of the Harry Potter World Series events, Potions Lecture: "What if Magic Were Real?" on Sept. 3 in Scholes 221.

Salix alba, more commonly known as the willow tree, is the main component in the No-Pain potion. Muggles may know it by another name, aspirin. D'Angelo also provided recipes for Instawake (coffee), Instacalm (catnip tea) and New-skin (antibacterial ointment).

"We like potions. We take them almost every day," he said.

A potion, according to Google, is "a liquid with healing, magical or poisonous properties." While D'Angelo's "potions" aren't really magical, he likened their ef-

fects to the progression of technology and medicine in the modern

"There are things that, even just 15 years ago, would not exist," he said.

One such example of this progression is video calling capability. Skype, Google Hangouts and FaceTime would have seemed like sorcery to people just 2 or 3 generations ago.

D'Angelo compared video calling to the Patronus Charm of the Harry Potter universe, citing an instance in Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows, when Kingsley Shacklebolt sends his patronus, a lynx, to warn the Order of the Phoenix about the fall of the Ministry of Magic.

One potions pupil inquired

about the possibility of making potions from animal sources, rather than plant materials. D'Angelo responded that it is very possible.

Recently, muggle scientists have discovered that the venom of a particular Brazilian wasp, Polybia paulista, kills cancer cells, but leaves healthy ones unaffected. It is very possible that new "potions" could be on the way in the search for a cancer cure.

By the night's end, it appeared someone had cast a nostalgic spell over the overcrowded classroom of potterheads.

"Snape and Slughorn would be so proud!" D'Angelo concluded. Witches and wizards who missed this event can find a full schedule at libguides.alfred.edu/harrypotter.


